## Equation Sheet \& Statistical Table Policy

You have the option to bring an equation sheet and the appropriate statistical table(s) to each exam. You must bring a calculator.

You may be allowed to bring an equation to some quizzes, but not all quizzes. The instructor will announce before each such quiz ${ }^{1}$.

Your equation sheet must conform to the following:

- It must be handwritten.
- A photocopy of another student's equation sheet is not allowed.
- It must be self-prepared.
- Only relevant equations ${ }^{2}$ are allowed. Other content is prohibited.

The instructor will review your equation sheet during the examination. If your document is non-conforming, the instructor will confiscate it.

You should bring a copy of the necessary statistical tables(s) during the examinations. The table must not contain any information other than the standard contents of the statistical table. If your document contains inappropriate material, the instructor will confiscate it.

If you do not bring an equation sheet and/or statistical table(s), or if your material is(are) confiscated:

- You cannot bother your classmates for their material.
- The instructor may eject you from the examination for disturbing other students, and
- Your examination score will be a zero.

Bring a calculator. If you do not bring a calculator:

- You cannot use your smartphone instead, and
- You cannot bother a classmate.

Using your phone and/or disturbing classmates during an examination is unacceptable. You may be removed from the classroom, and your examination score will be a zero.
